Investigator Spotlight

Dr. Esther Leerkes





Dr. Esther Leerkes is the Primary Investigator on the STAR Project. She teaches both graduate and undergraduate courses addressing research in child development and parent-child relations. In her research, Dr. Leerkes focuses on social and emotional development within the family system. Dr. Leerkes has 3 children, loves spending time with her family, hiking, and fixing up her house with her husband.

Recently, Dr. Leerkes accepted an invitation from the National Institutes of Health's Center for Scientific Review to be a member of a grant review panel focused on Psychosocial Development, Risk and Prevention through June 2019. This committee makes recommendations about what research projects should be funded.

In addition to her work with the STAR Project, Dr. Leerkes is involved with other research projects. She is also the primary investigator for the Triad Child Study which looks at how moms respond when their infants cry and how that relates to children's ability to control their emotions.

Starting Kindergarten

- 1. Starting Kindergarten is an exciting time! The first step is enrolling your child in school. This typically happens in the Spring. Contact your County's' School System to learn which school your child will be assigned and what is needed to get them registered for next year.
- 2. Many school systems also require that you fill out an additional form if your child will ride the bus. Be sure to ask about this when you enroll your child.
- 3. If you are looking for before/afterschool care, most schools offer a low cost program. These programs require you to fill out a separate application at the time you register your child.

Pumpkin Pie Scented Playdough

Ingredients:

- 1 Cup flour
- 1/3 cup salt
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ tsp cloves
- 2 tsp cinnamon
- ½ tsp nutmeg
- 1 TBSP Cream of Tartar
- 1 TBSP vegetable or canola oil
- 4-5 drops each of yellow and red food dye
- 1 cup water

Directions:

Mix ingredients and cook on the stove on medium heat until the playdough becomes firm. Allow to cool, and have fun!
